Opiate Overdose Prevention Program

Are you concerned about a family member using Heroin or Pain Killers???

Naloxone(Narcan) is a medication that can help SAVE THE LIFE of someone who may have overdosed on opiates.



Training dates: (Limit 10 registrants per class)

Every 2nd Friday from 9am-11am

Every 4th Friday from 1pm-3pm

The training will include:

- Recognition of the symptoms and signs of opioid overdose
- How to properly administer Naloxone (Narcan) if an overdose is suspected
- Proper rescue breathing technique
- The importance of contacting emergency medical services
- The care of an individual after the administration of Naloxone (Narcan)
- How to obtain and fill a prescription for Naloxone (Narcan)
